# JOHN MCCAIN PROMISES Business As Usual

McCain has more than 130 lobbyists working on or raising money for his campaign, and he voted with President Bush 95 percent of the time in 2007. #### SHIP OUR JOBS OVERSEAS.

McCain says "NAFTA was a good idea" and supports trade agreements that have sent at least 2.3 million jobs overseas. He supported tax breaks for companies that ship jobs overseas and tried to weaken and waive "Buy American" laws that keep jobs at home. #### TAX OUR HEALTH CARE.

McCain will create a new tax on working families by making employer-provided health benefits part of taxable income. While shifting the tax burden from employers to workers, he will give a \$2 billion tax break to the top 10 insurance companies. #### JEOPARDIZE OUR WAGES.

McCain repeatedly tried to undermine our wages by voting to repeal Davis-Bacon protections, abolish the minimum wage and oppose project labor agreements. McCain was endorsed by the anti-worker Associated Builders and Contractors.
